### **1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER**

Chair Armbruster called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm.

### **3A. Approval of Minutes**

The draft June minutes were discussed and as a result, a couple item numbers were corrected. Additionally Susan pointed out that the "Water Fowl Hunting Update" and the "Water Sample" items needed to be revised. The committee discussed the revisions and subsequently voted unanimously to approve the revised June minutes.

### **3B. 2022 PROJECT UPDATE**

The committee discussed the following lake projects:

- Harvesting has started yesterday and still on going with anticipated completion by July 18.
- Natural shoreline demonstration project: The agreement between the County Board of Commissioners (BOC) and the Township has been signed. The consultant has

applied to the state to obtain the shoreline improvement permit. The project will be bid after the permit has been issued.

- The shoreline survey is now scheduled for early August.

### **3C. SEAWALL CONSTRUCTION & REPAIR REGULATIONS**

As part of the advisory committee's goal of educating residents around the lake about regulations and requirements for maintenance and construction activities near the lake, a brochure was included with summer newsletter. The two-page brochure included related best management practices, contact information for local and state departments, and a QR code for additional information.

### **3D. PARK MANAGER'S REPORT**

Park Manager Emens stated that there were no bids received for the Lake Lansing South improvement project. He added that the project would be re-bid in the fall with few design modifications.

### **3E. REPORT ON THIS YEAR'S LANDING BLITZ CAMPAIGN**

As part of this years' Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) awareness week, several members of the advisory committee participated in this statewide campaign. Susan thanked committee members, Ron Rowe, Roger Taylor & Curt Armbruster for joining her on Saturday, July 9. Collectively, they approached the owners of over 20 watercrafts, handed out AIS literature and helped them inspect their boats. Unlike last year, the weather was very favorable. The group look forward to having a second cleaning station with the CD3 unit (an electric air-powered hose & vacuum) so boaters are encouraged to clean before & after using our lake.
