1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER
  1. Chair called meeting to order at 4:30 PM.
  
2. ROLL CALL
  1. Present: Chair Farris, Commissioners Lick, McDonald, Rambo and Stephens were present at roll call.
  2. Staff present: Director Wisinski
  3. Guests present: Richard Miksicek, Environmental Commission liaison, and David Batten and Sue Ziara (Meridian Market Gleaning Program)
  
3. PUBLIC COMMENT
  1. There was no public comment.
  
4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA
  1. Commissioner Lick moved to approve the agenda, Commissioner Rambo seconded.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES
  1. April 8, 2025 Park Commission Regular Meeting Minutes
    1. Chair Farris moved to clarify that under Discussion Item 1. A. that language about August be removed with the millage renewal.
    2. Commissioner Stephens moved to approve the minutes, as amended. Commissioner Lick seconded.
  
6. PRESENTATIONS
  1. Farmer’s Markets Gleaning Program Presentation
    1. David Batten and Sue Ziara, members of the Meridian Market Gleaning Program, presented on how the program started, and where the program is headed in the upcoming outdoor season. The commissioners thanked Dave and Sue for their time, and commended them on their organization of the program.
  
7. COMMUNICATIONS
  1. May Stewardship Calendars
    1. Director Wisinski shared the May Stewardship calendar and that the land stewardship team currently in northern Michigan at an eastern Mississauga rattlesnake training.
  2. Parks and Recreation Playbook
    1. Director Wisinski updated the Park Commissioners on the monthly Parks and Recreation newsletter that is developed with the Communications department. One highlight of the Playbook included details about the Meridian Pride event.
  3. Commissioner Rambo moved to place the communications on file, Commissioner Lick seconded.

8. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Meridian Township Parks and Recreation 5-Year Plan
  - a. Director Wisinski asked the members of the Park Commission how they would like to have this information presented. Chair Farris asked Director Wisinski to create a timeline with Township Manager Dempsey.
2. Red Cedar Watertrail Program – MDNR Water Trail Designation Application
  - a. Director Wisinski discussed the hiring process for a part-time employee focused on the Red Cedar Waterway and Land Preservation. Director Wisinski spoke about the work group made up of members of Williamston, Williamstown Township and Meridian Township, and how she has been working to apply for a Water Trails Designation through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. The Middle Grand and Grand Rivers have already applied for designation. Chair Farris brought up legislation that was proposed at the state level regarding the Michigan Recreation passport, and Commissioners Stephens and McDonald encouraged everyone to contact their elected officials regarding the legislation.

9. ACTION ITEMS

1. There were no action items.

10. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A. Budget Updates

- a. Director Wisinski asked the commissioners to look at the April 2025 budget report, and shared progress on each of the projects. The first (5280 Okemos Road) project is part of the Phase II trailhead – part of the larger MSU to Lake Lansing trail – and the grant that was applied for in March, staff still has not heard back from NRTF. NRTF will likely make decisions in the fall.
- b. Director Wisinski has requested bids for both the Towner Road Inclusive Playground, and Ottawa Hills Playground. In the future, Director Wisinski would like to see all playgrounds have inclusive elements.
- c. The Marshall Park amenities include a shade structure. Chair Farris noted that when she visited Marshall Park, it was difficult to navigate because of the direct sun, and looks forward to improvements. The commission asked that future plans include neighborhood children in the participation process.
- d. Cricket field progress has stalled, as staff was waiting for the fields to dry out from the spring rain. The Towner Road baseball field restoration was completed in the spring.

B. Senior and Community Center Updates

- a. Director Wisinski shared the history of the task force and what the Township Board was contemplating regarding millage rates during their last board meeting. The commissioners asked a few questions of Director Wisinski, including the general cost of both the building and operations.

C. Miscellaneous

- a. There were no miscellaneous items.

11. COMMISSIONER LIAISON REPORTS

1. Township Board Report – Chair Farris
  1. Chair Farris attended the Township Board meeting the previous week, and shared her thoughts on the Township Board's decision of a stand-alone senior center, or combined senior/community center.
2. Land Preservation Report – Commissioner Stephens
  1. Commissioner Stephens commented that field season was underway for the land preservation team.
3. Environmental Commission Report – Commissioner McDonald
  1. Commissioner McDonald asked that staff connect and introduce Commissioner McDonald to the Environmental Commission.
4. Historical Village Report – Commissioner Rambo
  1. Commissioner Rambo did not have an update.
5. Nokomis Cultural Center – Commissioner Lick

1. Commissioner Lick informed the other commissioners of the language classes and Saturday craft socials that the Nokomis staff and volunteers put on every week for the community. Commissioner Lick planned to attend a board meeting in the future.

12. PUBLIC COMMENT

1. Richard Miksicek, Environmental Commission liaison, reported on the EC's recent meeting, and decisions made there regarding a trail connector wetland use permit, and clarifications regarding the bioswale at Marshall Park. The Environmental Commission is also planning on tabling regarding Planting a Green Meridian.

13. OTHER MATTERS AND COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

1. Commissioner Stephens updated the commissioners on getting out in the community and having children fish. Commissioner McDonald raised the idea of naming part of Newton Road Park after a pillar in the Haslett lacrosse community. Commissioner Lick asked Director Wisinski if Director Wisinski could share a copy of the park naming rules at the next meeting. Commissioner Rambo commented that she recently visited Wonch, and it is a well-utilized park in the park system. Chair Farris noted that the next meeting would be Tuesday, June 10<sup>th</sup> at the Service Center.

14. ADJOURNMENT

1. The meeting was adjourned at 5:42 PM.

**Re:** 2025 Celebrate Meridian Recap

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The annual Celebrate Meridian Festival took place on June 28, 2025, and has continued to grow significantly over the past several years. This exciting community event featured a wide variety of activities, including the Farmers Market, live entertainment, beer gardens, food trucks, children's activities, vendors, and participation from both the Nokomis Cultural Heritage Center and the Meridian Historical Village. Art and business vendors added further enthusiasm to the day.

Over the past two years, the Parks and Recreation Department has worked to enhance the festival by introducing cultural performances and replacing the traditional fireworks with a more inclusive and environmentally friendly drone show.

Planning for the event begins in January and requires a truly collaborative effort involving the Parks and Recreation Department, Police, Fire, Communications, DPW, community partners, and dedicated volunteers. The event planning team and maintenance staff did an exceptional job this year, and their expertise, time, and commitment were essential in making the festival a success.

As with any large-scale event, a few challenges occurred. The most notable was a brief technical issue with the drone show, but staff responded quickly and efficiently to address the problem.

Looking ahead, the planning team will debrief and begin preparations for an even more successful 2026 Celebrate Meridian Festival.

**Re:** Policy Statement for Naming Meridian Parks

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In response to a recent inquiry, I recommend a review and discussion of the *Policy Statement for Naming Meridian Parks*, originally adopted by the Park Commission on April 15, 2008.

This review will ensure the policy remains relevant and reflects the current values, practices, and growth of our community.

## **Policy Statement for Naming Meridian Parks**

Adopted by Park Commission April 15, 2008

The Meridian Township Park Commission, hereby establishes this policy regarding the naming of public parks and park features within the Township. The name shall be based upon criteria established by this policy with the Park Commission having the final authority. Consideration will be given to naming, but not limited to, these listed examples.

### **Park Names**

- May be named for a person, family, organization, corporation or other entity that played a significant role in the founding and early development or redevelopment of the Park.
  - A benefactor donated all of the park land or contributed 75% or more of the purchase price for the park land.
  - A benefactor who made a significant gift to the parks of a minimum of \$500,000.
  - A person can be recognized for sustained commitment and dedication to the park

### **Park Buildings/Facilities**

- New Facilities or additions to existing facilities consistent with the latest 5-year Parks and Recreation Master Plan and/or projects approved by the Park Commission, may be selected for funding by a benefactor wishing to make a gift for the construction of a specific facility.

### **Park Feature or Element Names**

- A park feature or element such as, but not limited to, a structure, addition to a structure, an amenity (benches, grills, play equipment), an athletic field, or a bridge, may be named for a donor who contributes 100% of the cost for the element.
- A benefactor who provides a significant bequest of \$250,000 or more to a Park may be honored by having a particular park feature named on behalf of that donor.

### **Endowed Position Names**

- A particular position, such as that of a Nature Center Naturalist, may be named for a benefactor who funds an endowment, the proceeds of which would be sufficient to fund the salary and fringe benefits of such a position.

### **Miscellaneous**

- If the name is not used in the actual name of the Park, a sign, marker or plaque honoring the person's memory can be placed in the Park in accordance with the applicable regulations and policies of the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Under some circumstances, a portion of donations or bequests may be designated for perpetual care and maintenance of a particular gift; such as, but not limited to, benches, trees, or gardens that would require continued upkeep.

### **Process for Name Proposal**

An individual or group living in Meridian Township may propose a name using an application available from the Meridian Township Parks and Recreation Department. The Park Commission will review the proposals to ensure that the application(s) is complete.

A notice will be published on the web site for Meridian Township and in the local newspaper requesting public feedback on the proposal(s) for a 30 day period.

At the conclusion of the 30 day feedback period, the Park Commission will make a decision, by a majority vote, and announce it at their next regular scheduled meeting.
